



Meeting Minutes
November, 1, 2011

President Diane Baker called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Treasurer's Report: Cindy Case: We have approximately \$90,000 in our accounts. This month there were deposits for the Kidstuff books, business sponsorships, and our expenses were for remaining BandaRama expenses.

Financial Secretary's Report: Maki Traynor: Please make sure your profits added to your student accounts for the Kidstuff Books are correct. There is now a tab on Charms to move money from student accounts to trip payments.

Recording Secretary's Report: Laurie Kissinger: The minutes are posted online in the week following the meeting. The minutes from last month's meeting were approved by Michelle Kauffman, and seconded by Michelle Chambers. They were approved by a unanimous vote.

Vice President's Report: Cathy Sangillo was not in attendance.

Student Officer's Report: Emily Longenecker and Emily Mountain: The students arrived in trick or treat attire as a "Dairy Fairy" and a "Birthday Ghost". The students reported on the many activities in the last month. They felt that the CV show was their best performance of the year. Senior Recognition was last week, and Emily L. was very proud of her parents for coming in costume. The officers also reported that they have filmed a special feature for the CD action news about the Clorox grant fundraising program.

Band Director's Report: Mr. Ceresini: Who would have thought that snow in October would create a conflict with our scheduling? He is working on making a decision about whether to have the Keynotes concert or participate in the now re-instated Holiday parade. The only date available to hold the Keynotes concert is on November 19th, which is the date of the parade.

Recaps: For the most part, the weather has been great for our performances this month. In the past few weeks, the performances have really improved, and the kids are really getting into the show. They had a great time at the Dillsburg Parade, and Senior Night is always a nice evening. Jazz I performed at the Four Diamonds assembly and did a great job.

Upcoming events: Light the Night will be held at 6:00 on Sat, and they should be back at school by 7:00. The Hershey Show is Sunday morning with an 8:56 performance time. This is a great stadium to perform in. Jazz Bands have a nursery school coming to the Jazz I class next week. Upcoming Jazz performances include Strawberry Square on December 2, then the Holiday Dessert Dance, and a performance at the Rotary Club. The concert Bands will be performing their Veterans Day concert on November 8th and the Wind Ensemble will play November 11 for the Alumni unveiling of the CD Memorial Monument.

Indoor season is coming up soon. This is a cross district activity with students in Percussion, Guard, and Majorettes. The practices will start in late November and the season runs through May. It is likely that the

groups will go to Wildwood this year, with some arrangements being worked on to allow students to attend the prom if they wish. The Majorettes will practice Sunday and Wednesday, Guard Monday and Wednesday, and Drumline Tuesday and Thursday.

Old Business:

Memberships: Working on trying to get this finalized. We currently have less than half of the band families as members in the boosters. We would like to be able to say that we represent most of the band families involved in the program. If you have not yet joined the boosters, please consider doing it today! The patron membership program is underway, and we have had 9 people join so far.

Business Sponsorship: We have raised approximately \$11,000 with this program. The program is still open for sponsorships; please contact Kim St. Clair with any questions.

KidStuff Books: We had a profit of \$1330 to student accounts, and \$570 to Boosters. We have 9 books left-they would make great Christmas gifts!

Wolfgang Candy: The order forms are available tonight, and the students will be bringing them home. The orders are due on November 29, and will be delivered the week before Christmas. The profits will be a 70/30 student/boosters split. Melissa requested that you collect cash or check made out to you, and submit only one check to the Boosters with your order.

Shed: Jeff Case is preparing the engineering drawings to be submitted to the township to move forward on the building permit.

Audit: Thanks to Mark Kissinger for completing this. Cindy submitted his report.

Taxes: Cindy and Jeff Case have submitted the request for an extension; the 990 report is now due on Feb. 15th.

Marine Band: Our application is being processed.

Clorox grant: We are averaging 400 votes per day. With the number of students and families involved we could easily be getting up to 1,000 per day! Keep on voting!!

Holiday Dessert Dance: Flyers are available to take home and hang up in the community. Diane reminded the group that no matter what your kids say, parents do attend this event.

Craft Show: The application packets were mailed to the crafters last week, and Judy has received 3 back already.

Karns: Vouchers are available tonight and online for our week November 7-13. Please hand them out to friends and neighbors; just don’t accost people in the Karns parking lot!

HERCO: Cheryl Martin is the new coordinator for this program. The group was reminded that after Christmas CandyLane is closed, the only shifts available will be at the Giant Center and Chocolate World. Very few of our band families are participating in this program, but it is a great way to add to your student account.

Wearables: There is a Holiday flyer available with some special new items that would make great Christmas gifts! The orders are due by November 11, and there is a minimum order necessary on some of the items. The info is available on the website.

Restaurant fundraisers: There was some discussion about area restaurants offering fundraising opportunities to non profit groups. Connie Sheetz has volunteered to gather some information about these programs and present them to the finance committee.
